Explaining the Standard Conjugation Table

Aspects

The aspects which the Classical Arithide verb are marked for number three: the **imperfective**, denoting a continuous timeflow; the **perfective**, denoting the action as a discrete whole; and the **perfect**, denoting the state resulting from the action. These are listed along the leftmost column of the table, along with the three principal marked parts of each form.

Primary moods & the Future tense

The primary moods of the Classical Arithide verb are the **realis**, which indicates that the action in fact took place, and the **irrealis**, which denotes hypothetical situations, conditional situations, or situations that are outrightly false. These, depending on the context, may also take on connotations of telicity. They are ranged along the top row of the table, along with the **future tense**, the only tense marked in Classical Arithide, and a late development.

Independent forms and derivations

The “independent forms” of the Classical Arithide verb are those not inflected for time, aspect or mood, namely the **gerund**, the **imperative**, and the **cohortative**. The alternative voices of the root verb, i.e. the **causative**, the **potentive**, the **middlisation** and the **passivisation** are also listed, in that order. Derivative nouns are such like the **supine**, the **agentive** noun, **instrumentative** noun, the **patientive** nouns, and the **locative** noun; while derivative verbs encompass the secondary moods and aspects of the verb, here listed being the **habitual**, **inceptive**, **frequentative**, **protractive**, **volitive** (which expresses willingness and in polite situations is a substitute for the desiderative), **desiderative** (which denotes “I want to...”), **jussive** (to express the speaker’s desire for the listener to carry out some action), and the **subjunctive**. This last is used much differently from its familiar counterparts in Indo-European languages: not only does it express the hypothetical “if”, but it can also be employed to express the hope or wish of the speaker, regarding conditions and situations over which the speaker has no control. This is particularly pertinent in prayers and religious texts in which exhortations are made make extensive use of the subjunctive. In certain limited contexts, it may also express the equivalent of the Indo-European conditional mood.
